Critical thinking helps in analyzing the problem logically, identifying possible causes and evaluating different solutions.

Decision making involves selecting the best possible solution based on reasoning, evidence, and potential outcomes.

Creativity allows for innovative and out-of-the-box thinking, which is crucial when conventional solutions do not work.

Effective problem-solvers use a systematic approach that allows them to break down difficult problems into smaller, more manageable parts.

In English, there are four main skills that we know, namely listening skill, writing skill, reading skill, and speaking skill. But this article will be focus on the speaking ability or speaking skill. Speaking is an important part of effective communication. Speaking is a tool of communication and used to share any information. "Speaking is one of the most important and essential skills that must be practiced to communicate orally" (Casilli, 2013). In fact, someone with a good speaking ability will be easier in communicating as well as sending and receiving information to others. Therefore, it can be concluded that speaking is a technique of constructing and sharing information, both verbal and nonverbal based on various context. Speaking is a technique in building meaning, including producing, receiving, and processing records. Speaking and the meaning of it relies on the context of where that happened, which is consist of contribution, experience, environment, and the function. Harmer (2007) stated that speaking is the core skill of mastering how to speak fluently. It can be concluded that speaking is one of the most important skill that is used for making communication to others. Beside of the significance of speaking skill, many students still think that speaking is one of tough lesson in English.

Students' difficulties in speaking English that the main problems they face in learning speaking skills are a lack of vocabulary, the need for articulation, the need to speak without hesitation, and anxiety of making mistakes when speaking. In addition, students feel embarrassed to speak English and express the right assumptions and concepts because they are afraid of making mistakes in pronouncing the words. In addition, students face various components that affect their speaking ability, as shown by several students.

The factors causing the speaking problems are lack of general knowledge, lack of speaking practice, fear of mistake, lack of words usage and grammar practice, low motivation, low participation, reading laziness, shyness, less dictionary usage, nervousness, fear of criticism, and unfamiliar words pronunciation.

Speaking is one of important skills to be mastered. Speaking is very important because by mastering speaking skill, students are able to make conversation with others, to give the ideas and to exchange the information with others. Learning English means learning language components and language skills. Grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation, and spelling are examples of language components. Among the four skills, speaking is often considered as the most difficult skill to be learned by the students. English teacher should have teaching strategies to solve the problems faced by the students. The teacher must be able to manage their assignments effectively. They are demanded to motivate the students in order to learn English well. Related to that statement, teaching technique becomes one of the important points on the teaching learning activities. To teach speaking is not an easy job.

In the current fast-changing global economy, employers often identify everyday problem solving as crucial to the success of their organizations. Problem solving activities are great for learners to make decisions and to build confidence. These advanced skill sets are preparation for adulthood and are imperative for success in this dynamic information age.

As teachers, we often acknowledge the importance of these activities. But many times we fall short of ideas that can help us to foster these new-age skillsets in our learners.

Problem-solving strategies that teachers can demonstrate, model, and teach directly include trial and error, process of elimination, making a model, using a formula, acting out the problem, using graphics or drawing the problem, discovering patterns, and simplifying the problem (e.g., rewording, changing the setting, dividing it into simpler tasks).

K-W-L charts are a great way to engage pupils in a new topic – helping them to recall knowledge, develop a purpose for learning, and track their progress. These graphic organizers are designed to highlight what you know (K), want to know (W), and have learned (L).

Use the first column to assess or activate pupils' prior knowledge. In the second column, get the pupils to plan their learning by generating a series of questions about the topic. Pupils then use the final column to summarize their learning. The first and last columns can be helpful for retrieval practice – trying to recall information without it in front of you to cement long-term learning.

- e. Think and act creatively
- f. Solve problems faced realistically
- g. Stimulate the development of student thinking progress to complete problems encountered with the right.

The weakness learning problem solving are:

- a. It takes quite a lot, because the students need the much time to think and analyze the problems.
- b. The ability of students in solving different problems, sometimes students can not to solve the problems because they difficult to think and analyze the problems.

What are problem-solving skills?

Problem-solving skills help you determine the source of a problem and find an effective solution. Although problem-solving is often identified as its own separate skill, there are other related skills that contribute to this ability.

Some key problem-solving skills include:

Active listening
